

P. T. BARNUM IS DEAD. THE SHOWMAN EXPIRES AT HIS HOME.

Without Exception He Was the World's Greatest Showman—Some of His Notable Enterprises—Sketch of His Long and Remarkable Career.

Phineas Taylor Barnum, the great showman, died at Marina, Conn., after an illness of twenty-two weeks. He had died that while period firmly insisted that his sickness was only temporary, and that he would soon be out again.
