Spring Wheat All Sowed—Winter Wheat Headed Out—Corn Planting Progressing Favorably—General Condition of the Country Dry—Effect of the Recent Hard Frost.

The grain growing areas of the country have experienced a period of dry weather accompanied by severe frosts which are thought to have damaged more or less the small fruit, nipped the spring wheat, and what is done to the winter wheat, which is just heading out, it is impossible at this time to say.
