

LOCAL EVENTS.

An examination for an honorary scholarship in the University of Illinois will be held at the office of the County Superintendent of Schools, at Pontiac, on the 19th and 20th inst. Each competitor will choose whether he will be examined in to enter upon a technical or upon a literary course. If he chooses a technical course he will be examined upon Algebra, and to including quadratic equations; Geometry, plain, solid and spherical; Physiology; Natural Philosophy; Botany; English Rhetoric; and Composition, covering such parts of the several subjects as are usually taught in the better public high schools of the state. In the literary course the subjects will be Algebra and Geometry as before; Physiology or Natural Philosophy; the first four books of Caesar's commentaries; the four orations of Cicero against Calpurnia; that for the Post Archias; for the Munition law, and the first six books of Virgil's Aeneid. That person whose standing shall be the highest in this examination shall be awarded an honorary scholarship exempt from any fee for tuition or incidental expense. Provided that a scholarship shall not be awarded to any person whose standing shall be less than 75 upon a scale of 100, or an average of 80 upon the same scale. Other things being equal, the descendants of soldiers or seamen who served in the armies or the navies of the U. S. in the late rebellion shall be preferred. The scholarship awarded as above, shall be good for four years and not transferable.
