Fire in the Tygart Allen Fertilizer works at Greenwich Point, Pa., caused a loss of \$90,000.

Union carpenters throughout the country will demand an eight-hour working day after May 1.

Rev. Mr. Edwards, assistant clergyman in a church at Toronto, has disappeared, leaving a large number of creditors.

The brakemen on the Mobile and Birmingham road struck for \$55 per month; their places have been filled with negroes.

Peter Wright, of St. Joseph, Mo., under sentence of death, has been granted a stay of execution by the Missouri supreme court.

Several hundred real estate brokers from all over the country are in convention at Nashville, their object being to organize a national society.

In a drunken quarrel between two brothers named McSorley, in New York, the one cut the other's throat; the victim is not expected to live.

The body of a 5-year-old girl has been discovered at York, O., and found to be petrified so perfectly that not a line or feature is changed.

During a post-mortem on the body of Annie Munson, at Chicago, it was discovered that her heart was on the wrong side and other members of the viscera out of place.

Biggest Woman in the World Dead. WINNIPEG, Man., Feb. 18.—There died at Dog Lake reservation, near Lake Manitoba, on the 2nd inst., the largest woman in the world. She was a squaw and was married to a buck named Chippewa. She weighed 700 pounds and measured thirty-four inches around the arm. It took a coffin seven feet long and five feet wide to hold her remains.

Failed to Prove His Case. OMAHA, Feb. 18.—J. E. Lonsdale, who sued The World-Herald for libel for publishing an interview in which he agreed to procure an abortion, failed to prove his case, and the jury brought in a verdict for the defendant.
