DOINGS OF CONGRESS.

MEASURES CONSIDERED AND ACTED UPON.

At the Nation's Capital—What is Being Done by the Senate and House—Old Matters Disposed Of and New Ones Considered.

The Senate and House.

In the Senate, on the 25 Mr. Dolph presented petitions from his State favoring government aid for the Nicaragua canal.

In the House, on the 31st, the debate on the Idaho contested election case was closed, and the voting was begun.

In the Senate on the 4th the pure food bill was taken up, and Mr. Vest stated at some length his position in regard to it.

In the House on the 7th, the House Committee on Military Affairs completed consideration of the army appropriation bill.

In the House on the 7th, the time was taken up by debate on the silver question. The Bland bill was the subject.

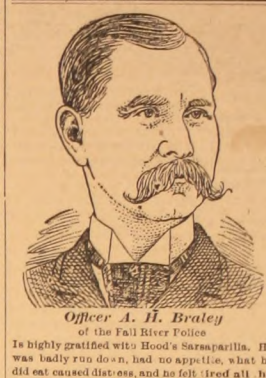
