Remains the only valuable daily pad calendar for '93, is of the same general design as that of previous years, consisting of 366 leaves, one for every day in the year, and a calendar for the entire year. The day of the week, of the month, and of the year are given, and on each leaf is a short sermon on the "Gospel of Outdoors, Health and Happiness," with valuable hints on practical road making. The leaves are so arranged that there will be no stub left, and each one can be referred to at any time during the year. The pad is upon a metallic stand of ivory black, arranged so as to rest upon the desk at a convenient angle. The pad matter, which in the aggregate is enough to make a book, is all fresh and new, and is of more pertinent value than that of any previous calendar. The calendar is issued by the Pope Mfg. Co., of Boston, New York, and Chicago.

Sunday Fire.

An alarm of fire was sounded Sunday night about 10 o'clock, which proved to be the coal and out house at the Keeley League headquarters, the property of The Leslie E. Keeley Co. The fire company responded in good time and made connections with the hydrant at the corner of Prairie avenue and Chipewaga street, near the new STAR AND HERALD building, and run out over 1,000 feet of hose. EDUCATIONAL COLUMN.

Employment of Strangers.

Directors cannot be too careful when they employ to conduct the school. When engaging a teacher, they should satisfy themselves on the following points: First—Is the applicant of good moral character? Second—Is the applicant seeking this position as a last resort? Third—What has been the record of the applicant, (a) as a student, (b) as a teacher? Fourth—What does the applicant know about the "course of study"? Fifth—Has the applicant certificate and are the grades first-class? With regard to the first, too much care cannot be exercised. See that the recommendations are from persons of position and worth. Take their names and addresses in writing, and regarding the person recommended before giving an affirmative answer. It may prove irksome sometimes, but it is always safe on the following example will show: One J. B. Merchant, of Ohio, was interviewed at this office, bearing recommendations from ministers at his home place, and holding teacher's certificates in three States.
