CHAPTER No. 82. An Ordinance providing for the issue of Bonds of and by the Village of Dwight in the amount of Eight Thousand Dollars, for the purposes specified in said Ordinance, and providing for the payment of the said Bonds.

Section 1—That the Board of Trustees of the Village of Dwight do hereby certify that to provide a fund to defray the necessary expenses and liabilities of said village of Dwight, the clerk of said village, and directed by the board of trustees, to issue six thousand dollars in bonds...

Section 2—That the Board of Trustees of the Village of Dwight do hereby certify that the sum of eight hundred eighty dollars, to pay the interest maturing on all of said bonds on the 1st day of April, 1898, and the principal of one thousand...

Section 3—That the Board of Trustees of the Village of Dwight do hereby certify that the sum of one thousand four hundred eighty dollars, to pay the interest maturing on all of said bonds on the 1st day of April, 1898, and the principal of one thousand...

Section 4—That the Board of Trustees of the Village of Dwight do hereby certify that the sum of one thousand four hundred eighty dollars, to pay the interest maturing on all of said bonds on the 1st day of April, 1898, and the principal of one thousand...

Section 5—That the Board of Trustees of the Village of Dwight do hereby certify that the sum of one thousand four hundred eighty dollars, to pay the interest maturing on all of said bonds on the 1st day of April, 1898, and the principal of one thousand...

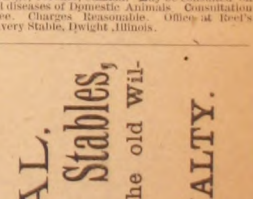
