Dr. Blaine also made an address on the same subject, which was appreciated very highly by the members.

Womans' Auxiliary Keeley League

The number of Womans' Auxiliary Keeley Leagues is constantly increasing; little work has been done up to January last, but since that time vigorous efforts have been made. The work is being pushed as rapidly as possible. Seven Auxiliaries have been chartered this month, and a few more are being organized. The St. Louis Auxiliary, organized in January, has already sent its first patient to Kirkwood Institute. Some of the older Auxiliaries have sent their fifth or sixth patient.

The Topeka Auxiliary were active in making sentiment in favor of the bill before their legislature asking for the State utilization of the cure.
