Jewellers' Waste Material. Every precaution is taken in the establishment of a jeweller who knows his business for the preservation of all material thought to contain the slightest suspicion of gold or silver that may have fallen from the work-table.

The bulk of the filings are caught in a tin tray fixed on the workman's knees, and held by means of a "satin." Of course, notwithstanding this care, a certain proportion of the dust falls on to the floor, clings to the tools and to the hands of the workman, or to the brushes and burrs with which the articles are polished.

Both the work-tables and the floor of the shop are swept carefully every morning, and the dirt gathered up and placed in a box.

The water in which the workmen wash before leaving the place is poured into a barrel and allowed to settle, and the more scrupulous employers have their men's aprons cleaned, and the water kept in the same way.

The following morning the clear water is drawn off by a tap half way up the tub, and the sediment allowed to remain at the bottom.

Everything is burnt with the exception of the metal, which remains in a lump at the bottom of the crucible.

The lump is then passed on to the refiner, who separates the metals and makes a return of their value to be forwarded to the customer, who either has the gold, silver, and copper sent back to him and pays a small amount for the cost of smelting, or sells it at market prices to the smelters.
