Bulletin.

Pittsburg, Pa., Sept. 22, 1893.

This bulletin is issued in order that all Leagues may be informed at once of the more important matters that came before the convention. It will require several weeks to issue the official proceedings. The amended constitution will be sent to all Leagues as soon as it can be printed.

There were 336 delegates and 193 alternates in the Convention and the parade in the world's fair grounds, September 15th, had over 1200 men in line and was a mile in length.

The revoking of the charter of No. 12 of Illinois by the Executive Board was thoroughly investigated by a committee of five lawyers. No. 12 called many witnesses and the Executive Board none.

The National Secretary appeared for the Board. The committee unanimously decided that the executive board had acted wisely; that the action should be sustained and that delegates from No. 12 should not be admitted.

The amendments to the constitution are very important. An associate membership is created, composed of those who have never been treated for inebriety and who are privileged to join Keely graduates in applications for charters. Per capita tax was done away with and a 20 cent tax fixed for each new member, either active or associate.
