BOARD OF HEALTH.

To the People of Dwight, Illinois, and Immediate Neighborhood:—In Time of Peace Prepare for War.

Winter with its changeable weather is now upon us. Wet feet and sore throats and other complaints, will be the consequences.

I am, as President of the Board of Trustees, under the statutes of Illinois, the acting "Board of Health" of this Village; therefore, in order to save the people of this village trouble and anxiety and money, I have districted this village into wards and districts, and appointed for each ward, one member of the Board of Trustees, to whom should be reported any case of Scarlet Fever, Diphtheria or other contagious diseases by the Doctor attending the same. We are a very healthy community and by proper care and vigilance, hope to be able to keep it so.

To the parents of school children, I would say, be honest and just to your fellow-man. Should your children feel sick, ascertain your doctor, and should there be the least sign of contagious disease, keep them from school and thereby save trouble to your neighbor and avoid having the schools closed.

In order to facilitate the reports of doctors, I have appointed the members of the Board of Trustees, to receive reports for the respective districts, as follows:

1st. Dist.—Corner of Mason and Prairie Avenues, north and east to the Gooseberry creek, Mr. Geo. N. Flagler.

2d. Dist.—From the same corner north and west, Mr. B. A. Buck.

3d. Dist.—From the same corner south and west, Mr. D. B. Stevens.

4th. Dist.—From the same corner south and east, to creek, Mr. John Geis.

5th. Dist.—All of that part east of Gooseberry creek and south of Mason avenue, Mr. Roger Mills.

6th. Dist.—All of that part east of Gooseberry creek and north of Mason avenue, Mr. George S. Baker.
