AUXILIARY NOTES.

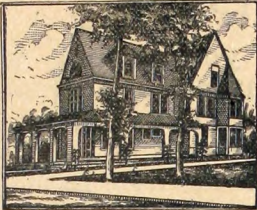

diana, vice-president; Grant Richardson, of Nebraska, secretary; P. W. Snowhook, C. H. Michael, Kirby Brockbrough, Lou Diggins, John Paxton, Dr. Ben C. Miller, Wm. L. Weitzel, Fred Garfield, E. B. Clark, W. M. Weese, Alonzo H. Hatch and N. Reinstrom, members. The first secretary really was W. M. Weese, the blacksmith in whose shop the meetings were held, but as he never made any written reports of the meetings, no record was kept of them until about six weeks after the organization of the club. April 21, 1891, the formal organization of the club was celebrated with a banquet given in a dining car of the Chicago & Alton road.

In November, 1891, the club had so far outgrown the idea of its original founders, that it was deemed necessary to make it a national instead of a local organization. On the 16th and 17th of November, 1891, this was accomplished and the

The Dwight Auxiliary was organized Nov. 1, 1892, at which time Mrs. Ida B. Cole called several ladies together and addressed them as to the objects of the Auxiliary. At an election last month Mrs Broughton was re-elected pres.; vice-pres., Mrs. Owens; sec. and treas., Mrs. Austin; corresponding sec., Mrs. Dr. Blaine; executive board, Mesdames Broughton, Barr, Romberger, Austin and Dustin.
