FRIGHTFUL RAILWAY WRECK IN NEW JERSEY.

Two Trains on the Lackawanna and Western Collide—Cars Filled with Persons En Route to New York to Work Are Smashed Into Pieces.

Signals Could Not Be Seen. There was a frightful accident on Monday morning on the west side of the Hackensack bridge, on the Morris and Essex branch of the Delaware, Lackawanna and Western Railroad.

Both of the trains that came into collision were bound for the Jersey City ferry landing. The Dover express, which is due at Jersey City at 8:20 o'clock, was steaming slowly on the Hackensack River. The fog was so dense that the engineer could not see fifty feet ahead, and was proceeding with extreme caution.
