Easter at the League. The announcement that Dr. Leslie E. Keeley would be at the league Sunday morning was sufficient to warrant a large attendance, notwithstanding the fact that the thermometer had dropped about 40 degrees during the night, and a chilling wind was blowing from most everywhere. The meeting was called to order at 9:30 by the president, and several selections were sung. About 10 o'clock Dr. Keeley came into the hall and congratulated all present on being present on the anniversary of the resurrection of Christ. He wished to read a paper and say a few words in relation to heredity. He had been regarding inebriety not being hereditary but he could prove that he was right and substantiate the proof. His paper was a clear exposition of the fallacy of the old threadbare notions that anyone inherited inebriety. He had proved conclusively that inebriety was a disease, and that nothing in the world could cause the disease except alcohol. Also that if inebriety was inherited, it could not be cured. The doctor has made a life study of this question and is to day the most thoroughly posted man in the world on the subject, and it will only be a short time until physicians all over the world will have to acknowledge that inebriety is not inherited, the same as they have had to acknowledge that inebriety is a disease. The doctor's paper and his remarks were listened to with intense interest by all present.

At the close Dr. Burdick, the examining physician at the laboratory, read a short paper which certainly clinched Dr. Keeley's argument. Dr. Burdick had inquired closely into the ancestry of the last one hundred patients he had examined, regarding the question of heredity, and found that over eighty per cent could not have inherited the disease simply because their ancestry were not diseased. But the graduates had had the disease and most of them had, and are cured men now. These are facts that no argument can overcome.
