Keeley League Meeting at Joliet.

There was a large gathering of Keeley leaguists and their friends in Joliet Wednesday evening, the Joliet league having prepared an interesting program, consisting of speaking, music and recitations. Mr. Quinn of Mar-selles, presided and after a piano solo, Dr. Leslie E. Keeley was introduced amid cheers, and spoke for about an hour, giving an outline history of the gold cure as administered under his direction, giving many of the ups and downs of its introduction. It was fourteen years ago the 11th of April since the first Keeley Institute was opened at Dwight. The Doctor also spoke of the inebriety of childhood and thoroughly explained the fallacy of inebriety being hereditary. His speech was received with great applause.

Mrs. I. N. Ives, of Bloomington, state president of the Illinois Keeley League auxiliary, was present and delivered a splendid address regarding the objects of the organization and the grand work being accomplished.

A very pretty recitation was then given, which was followed by Captain Jack Crawford, the poet scout. The first thing he said corroborated what Dr. Keeley had just said regarding inebriety not being hereditary. He said his father died a drunkard, and he himself had never drunk in his life and never had an appetite for it. Captain Jack interested the audience greatly with his frontier experiences, stories and poems.

Music followed, and Col. Nate A. Reed made a fine short talk, and a collection was taken up.

There were delegations present from the Dwight, Bloomington, Marshalls, Mionok, Morris and Chicago leagues, and all enjoyed a pleasant evening.

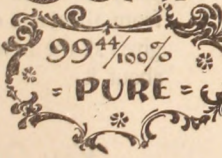

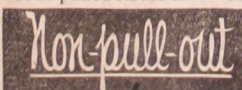
