RAILROAD FARES.

In regard to the matter of transportation, the Chairman of the Executive Board begs leave to state that rates of ONE AND ONE-THIRD FARE on all railroads in Illinois will be granted, provided 100 or more attend. There should be no doubt of the number being larger than that. It will be necessary to pay full fare going and one-third returning, on the certificate of the secretary. This is another reason why visiting parties should be reported as soon as possible so that arrangements may be made accordingly.
