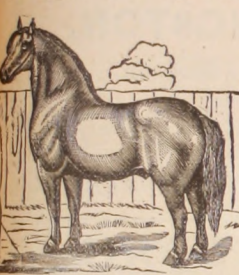

SCHOOL AND COLLEGE.

At the last census Nevada had only 4,931 girls of school age.
