SCHOOL AND COLLEGE.

Examinations.

Candidates for teachers' certificates will be examined on the following branches in the order given: Friday, beginning at 8:30 A. M., Written Arithmetic, Mental Arithmetic, Geography, Grammar, History and Orthography (on Saturday forenoon), Physiology, Pedagogy, Reading and Penmanship. For the first grade, in addition to the foregoing, Botany, Zoology and Philosophy are given.

The required average for a second grade is 80 per cent, with a minimum of 70; for a first grade, an average of 80 per cent, with a minimum of 75. Persons not personally known to the Superintendent must furnish references as to moral character. According to the provisions of the law, an institute fee of \$1 will be collected from each applicant. The required age is 18 for males and 17 for females.

The following are the dates for 1894: January 10 to 12, 13 and 17; March 16 and 17; April 20 and 21; May 18 and 19; June 15 and 16; None in July; August 17 and 18; September 21 and 22; October 19 and 20; November 16 and 17; December 21 and 22.
