National Keeley League.

The national convention of the Keeley League selected Harrisburg, Pa., as the seat of the fifth convention, which will be held in August of next year. The executive committee and the secretary and treasurer covered the last year's work, showing harmony and advancement in organization of territory and the number of cures effected with a better financial condition. Letters of regret were read from many distinguished men in all parts of the country, who were unable to be present. Dr. Keeley's speech in the afternoon was well received and created much enthusiasm.
