RECORD OF THE PROCEEDINGS, Orders and Resolutions of the Board of Supervisors of Livingston County, State of Illinois, at the Regular Sept. Meeting, 1894.

Table listing costs for Clerk's fees, Sheriff's costs, and other administrative expenses with amounts.

Total sheriff's and clerk's fees collected. So far I have devoted my attention only to books 12, 14, 15, 18 and 20...

The amounts to have been collected from fees books 12, 14, 15, 18 and 20, sheriff's and clerk's fees aggregate \$232.45...

Petitions from James Brown, assessor of Newtown, asking rebate of tax for Gus Wenselman and W. M. Shibley...

By unanimous consent Coroner Zimmerman appeared before the Board and made a statement regarding his bill for holding inquest on the body of Jerry Condon...

On motion of Thornton, the Board adjourned until 9 o'clock a. m. tomorrow.

THURSDAY, Sept. 13, 1894, 9 a. m. Board met pursuant to adjournment, Chairman Cleary presiding.

Minutes of yesterday's session were read and approved.

The following report from the committee on public property was read and on motion of Travis adopted:

State of Illinois, Livingston County, ss. Board of Supervisors, September term, A. D. 1894.

Mr. Chairman and Gentlemen of the Board of Supervisors: Your committee on public property would beg leave to submit the following report regarding court house janitor:

At the July meeting of the Board your committee employed one Thos. Egan as janitor. Shortly after the adjournment of the Board your committee became informed that said Egan refused to serve as janitor...

Minutes of yesterday's session were read and approved.

Gibbons called up his motion to receive applications for the position of janitor of the court house, and the question being put, the motion was lost.

A petition from T. W. Coe, sheriff, was presented and read, asking that he be allowed the sum of \$125.00 per year during his term of office as extra compensation.

On motion of Gibbons said petition was referred to the committee on auditing sheriff's accounts.

Gibbons moved that Cornwell fill the vacancy on committee on auditing sheriff's accounts, caused by the absence of Morrow at this meeting of the board.

The following report from the special building committee was read: To the Honorable Board of Supervisors of Livingston County, Ill.:

Table listing estimates for August 6, 1894, for various items like contracts, labor, and materials.

In addition to the above, we have paid Architect Edbrooke the sum of \$835.11, for which sum county order was issued payable to said Edbrooke.

Owing to the delay in getting the building started, as heretofore mentioned, your committee has abandoned all hope of finishing it before late in the coming spring...

Resolved, further, that the county clerk of said county of Livingston be, and he is hereby directed to mail a certified copy of this preamble and these resolutions to C. H. Chappell, General Manager of said Chicago & Alton Railroad company...

Resolved, further, that the county clerk transmit a certified copy hereof to the State Board of Equalization, now in session.

On motion of Cornwell, the board adjourned until 2 o'clock p. m.

THURSDAY, Sept. 13, 1894, 2 p. m. Board met pursuant to adjournment, Chairman Cleary presiding, who announced a quorum present.

Thornton moved that the chairman appoint a special committee of three to approve the bonds of the incoming county clerk, sheriff, county treasurer and county superintendent of schools...

Cornwell moved to amend by adding the chairman of this board to said committee.

The amendment being put to vote by the clerk was carried.

Original motion as amended carried.

Whereupon the chairman named as members of said special committee Thornton, Travis and Clark.

Myer moved that the board approve the appointment of said special committee.

Motion carried.

Thornton moved that the county clerk be instructed to obtain from J. N. Guthrie, superintendent of the county farm, the necessary affidavit to obtain the sum of \$100.00 with interest for one year...

Motion carried.

Goemmel moved that the board reconsider the report of the special elections committee adopted at the last July meeting.
