Sugar From Beets.

The following regarding the success of the beet sugar industry will be of interest to all:

NORFOLK, NEB., Oct. 20, 1894.

The sugar factory at Norfolk, Neb. is a success and the crop much larger than expected. 80,000 pounds of limestone are consumed every day. The mammoth boilers consume eighty-five tons of coal every day.

At the beginning of the season, which commences Oct. 1, it was estimated that there would be 20,000 tons of beets to work up. Since the harvest has fairly begun beets are yielding so much better than expected that it is now thought there will be 30,000 tons or more. The late rains were of great benefit to the beet crop, adding, it is conservatively estimated, 5000 tons to the total yield. If these estimates are correct the factory will continue in operation until Jan. 15. Last week the factory averaged 333 tons of beets a day and by Saturday night 1,000,000 pounds of sugar will have been sacked ready for shipment. It is believed from 6,000,000 to 7,000,000 pounds will be produced before the factory closes. The sugar is being marketed in Omaha, Denver, Sioux City and St. Paul, 225 laborers are employed.

The price paid for beets is \$5 per ton. 6 to 7 tons per acre is an average crop, some fields have yielded over 10 tons per acre. 21 tons per acre was the best yield. Sugar beets is all the farmers have to sell this season.
