TEACHERS' EXAMINATIONS.

In 1895 examinations for Teachers' Certificates will be held on the third Friday of each month from the Saturday following except that the only examination in July and August will be at close of the annual institute. An average standing of 80 per cent will be required for second grade certificates, and of 90 per cent for first grade, and no grade may be less than 70 for a second nor 80 for a first grade certificate. The live portfolios that applicants for second grade certificates shall be in Orthography, Reading, Writing, Arithmetic, Grammar, Geography, U. S. History, and Physiology, and for first grade, Natural Philosophy, Botany and Zoology are added. It also provides that an institute fee of \$1.00 be collected from each candidate and that certificates shall not be granted to males under 18 nor to females under 17 years of age. Examinations will be in at 8:30 a. m. and those candidates not well known to the superintendent must furnish satisfactory evidence of good moral character. The work of the office is such that time cannot be spared for private examinations.
