The election in 1900 takes place on Tuesday, November 6th. The people of Illinois will vote for the following officers: Twenty-four electors for president and vice president of the United States.
A governor, lieutenant governor, secretary of state, state treasurer, attorney general and three trustees of the state university.
In each of the twenty-two congressional districts, a member of congress and a member of the state board of equalization. In each of the twenty-five even numbered senatorial districts in the state, a senator. In each of the 51 senatorial districts of the state, three members of the house of representatives.
In each of the 101 counties in the state, a circuit clerk, a state's attorney, a coroner and a surveyor.
In each county of the state having a population of 60,000 or over, a recorder of deeds. In each county in the state not under township organization, except Cook county, one county commissioner.
In Cook county 15 county commissioners, one clerk of the superior court two members of the board of assessors, one member of the board of review.
