THE RESOLUTIONS.
The republicans of Livingston county in convention assembled take great pleasure in bearing testimony to the splendid administration of President McKinley. We heartily endorse his administration and stand as a unit for his renomination and re-election.
We have implicit confidence in the personal integrity and ability of Hon. Shelby M. Cullom, are proud of the position he occupies in the senate of the United States, and we distinctly favor his re-election.
We are proud of the economic administration of Governor John R. Tanner and cite our people to the contrast of his administration of the state institutions with his democratic predecessor. Finding the state embarrassed upon his taking the executive chair he has redeemed it from the effects of democratic misrule.
WHEREAS, There resides in the Eleventh Congressional District, a candidate for the republican nomination for governor, a man whose record as a model citizen and an honest, upright, able lawyer entitles him to the respect of all good citizens regardless of political affiliation, and whose experience in public life and especially in congress

has fitted him for any office within the gift of the people of the state of Illinois, therefore be it
RESOLVED, That it is the sense of the republicans of Livingston county represented in this convention, that the active, honest, gallant republican leader in this congressional district, Walter Reeves, be endorsed for governor, and we hereby pledge ourselves to use all honorable means to secure his nomination and election, believing as we do that if he is nominated in the state convention his name will add great strength to the entire republican ticket. So believing, we instruct our delegates to the state convention to vote first, last and all the time for his nomination.
THE PROCEEDINGS.
The convention met in the court room at 1:30. There was a full attendance from all over the county.
D. S. Myers, chairman of the county central committee called the meeting to order. G. W. Lacey read the call.
Chairman Myers, on behalf of the executive committee, recommended H. J. Clark of Pontiac, as temporary chairman and G. W. Lacey, of Pontiac, for temporary secretary.
The committee on credentials was Alex. McKay, Pontiac; Fred Fry, Waldo; I. M. Lish, Saunemin; Dr. Geo. Fordyce, Ancona; N. E. Fulton, Fairbury.
The temporary organization was made permanent.
C. F. H. Carrithers called attention to the convention of delegates of the congressional district to meet in Peoria at the time of the state convention.
D. C. Avery moved that the delegates to the state convention act as delegates to the district convention.
The committee on resolutions were: C. F. H. Carrithers, Fairbury; John Bodley, Lodemia; D. M. Lyons, Pontiac; John Shackleton, Amity; Fred Fisk, Eppards Point.
On motion of N. J. Myers, a committee of five was named by the chairman to recommend delegates to the state convention.
The committee was N. J. Myers, Eppards Point; R. F. Bradford, Pontiac; W. G. Dustin, Dwight; W. H. Oxley, Streator; Emory Gregg, Fairbury.
L. F. Strawn addressed the convention, paying a glowing tribute to President McKinley and the achievements of the republican administration. His remarks elicited frequent applause.
E. A. Agard read the report of the committee on credentials. Report adopted.
Judge Patton made a good natured, but forcible speech and was enthusiastically applauded.
The convention was entirely harmonious and very enthusiastic, breaking into applause upon every mention of the names of President McKinley,

Walter Reeves or Senator Cullom. The resolution endorsing the administration of Governor Tanner was also heartily applauded. The resolutions as a whole were adopted by a rising vote and Uncle John Bodley led the cheering.
All the speakers endorsed expansion in the most ringing phrases and the convention went with them to the fullest extent.
Judge Patton's remarks about Wm. J. Bryan were irresistibly funny.
Hon. C. F. H. Carrithers followed in a short, but eloquent speech that awakened the highest enthusiasm. He predicted the nomination of Congressman Reeves, saying that the people are with him and the politicians cannot defeat him.
