RURAL FREE DELIVERY.

The above is being established in many localities in Illinois and all over the country, and the postmaster at Dwight has taken the matter under consideration, and would be pleased to hear from any of the rural patrons of the Dwight office. The Dwight office has increased materially during the past two years, and the past year places the office in reach of the carrier system, but not being assured of keeping the receipts above \$10,000 no application will be made at present. But the establishing of rural delivery has nothing to do with that and is for the accommodation of the farmers.

A petition must be made by 100 farmers living in a continuous route of not less than twenty miles, and the delivery will be made once a day. The farmers must prepare some receptacle at their gates for mail to be placed in so that carriers will not have to dismount. The rural carriers carry a stock of stamps, postal cards, etc., and give receipts for money orders and enclose same in envelopes after being issued at office in town. Arrangements are now being made for rural carriers to receive registers also.

If any considerable number of farmers interested in this scheme desire information the postmaster will be pleased to give it to them. It has proven very satisfactory wherever established.
