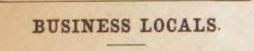

THE ST. LOUIS STRIKE.

End of the Street Railway Trouble Seems as Far Away as Ever—Casualties Thus Far.

St. Louis, June 1.—Albert Koening, a union man, emptied the contents of a shotgun yesterday into the body of Police Officer Crane and was himself instantly killed by a bullet from the revolver of Officer Maher. The sheriff of the county has sworn in 2,500 special deputies to aid the police department.

St. Louis, June 2.—Seven persons thus far have been killed in the street railway riots.

St. Louis, June 4.—In riots yesterday caused by the street railway strike a boy was killed and a young woman was stripped of her clothing and beaten for riding on a car.

St. Louis, June 5.—More riots and shooting occurred yesterday because of the street railway strike.

St. Louis, June 6.—The strike situation has assumed such a serious phase that 50 prominent citizens have asked Gov. Stephens to call out the militia for the protection of life and property. Riots yesterday mobbed a woman for riding in a street car and blew up a car with dynamite injuring four persons.

St. Louis, June 7.—The strike is becoming more serious and citizens are trying to force the governor to call out the militia.

WILL DEFY ALL EUROPE.

Dowager Empress of China Orders Non-Interference with the Boxer Movement.

Shanghai, June 6.—The China Gazette says it has the highest authority for stating that the dowager empress has ordered the tsung-li-yamen to face all Europe rather than to interfere with the boxer movement.

Washington, June 6.—At the cabinet meeting Tuesday Secretary Hay read a cablegram from Minister Conger at Peking to the effect that the situation in China was very unsatisfactory, and that even in Peking great alarm was felt. The minister will be given wide discretion in dealing with these new conditions.

Shanghai, June 7.—The soldiers dispatched to attack the boxers have fought an engagement quite close to Peking. Many were killed on both sides.

The Oregon Election.

Portland, Ore., June 6.—Returns from the state election give Weaver (rep.), for justice of the supreme court, a plurality of 7,951. For congressman in the First district Tongue (rep.) has 2,421 plurality. In the Second district Moody (rep.) for congressman, has 5,200 plurality. The republicans will control both branches of the legislature and will have a majority of 22 on joint ballot.

Name a National Ticket.

New York, June 7.—The socialist labor party in convention in this city nominated Joseph F. Maloney, of Lynn, Mass., for president of the United States. But one ballot was taken, and Mr. Maloney received the votes of 60 delegates, Valentine Rimmel, of Pittsburgh, getting 17 and W. B. Hammond, of St. Paul, one. Valentine Rimmel, of Pittsburgh, was named for vice president.

Declared Insane.

Des Moines, Ia., June 7.—A. J. Holmes, ex-congressman, well known Iowa politician, living at Boone, was declared insane by a commission. He served two terms in congress and was elected sergeant-at-arms of the house, following his retirement from his seat. Financial troubles are said to be the cause.

An Iowa Tragedy.

Sioux City, Ia., June 7.—Charles D. Reinhart, owner of the Reinhart flats in Sioux City and a wealthy land owner, shot and killed his wife Wednesday at Osceola, Ia., and then shot himself. He cannot live. He deliberately planned the crime.

Left a Surplus.

Washington, June 2.—The monthly comparative statement of the receipts and expenditures of the United States shows that during May the receipts aggregated \$45,166,053, and the expenditures \$40,351,625, leaving a surplus for the month of \$4,814,428. During the last 11 months of the fiscal year the receipts exceeded the expenditures by \$65,335,000.

Bank Note Circulation.

Washington, June 2.—The monthly statement of the comptroller of the currency shows that at the close of business May 1 last, the total circulation of national bank notes was \$30,498,390, an increase for the year of \$55,423,335, and an increase for the month of \$15,210,563.

Noted Educator Dead.

Madison, Wis., June 6.—Col. John G. McMunn, one of the oldest educators of Wisconsin and state superintendent from 1864 to 1868, died Tuesday at his home here.

AGUINALDO MAY BE DEAD

Filipino Leader Probably Killed or Wounded by American Troops Under Gen. Marsh.

BODY IS REMOVED BY HIS FOLLOWERS.

The Philippine Commissioners Arrive at Manila—Judge Taft Gives an Outline of Plans—Gen. MacArthur Will Continue in Control for Some Time—Skirmishes Daily.

Vigan, Luzon, June 2. via Manila, June 4.—Maj. March, with his detachment of the Thirty-third regiment, overtook what is believed to have been Aguinaldo's party on May 19 at La Gat, about 100 miles northeast of Vigan. The Americans killed or wounded an officer, supposed to be Aguinaldo, whose body was removed by his followers.

The officer shot was either Aguinaldo or his adjutant, and as the horse was richly caparisoned it is a fair presumption that it was Aguinaldo.

LAND IN MANILA.

Destination Reached by Philippine Commissioners.

Manila, June 4.—The United States transport Hancock, from San Francisco April 17, arrived here Sunday morning with the members of the Philippine commission.

Judge Taft, speaking regarding the powers and future work of the commission, said:

"We have full instructions and extensive powers. The latter we shall not exercise until we have had ample time to acquire sufficient knowledge of the situation to enable us to proceed to enact legislative changes and reforms, preliminary to the establishment of a stable civil government. Until we assume authority Gen. MacArthur will continue to perform the duties and exercise the powers formerly performed and exercised by Gen. Otis; and, even after we take active and full part in the government, Gen. MacArthur will continue as the executive head until, on our recommendation to President McKinley, it shall seem to the president that the time has arrived for the appointment of a civil executive, men of peace. The field of our work is necessarily confined to regions where the armed enemy has ceased his operations. We cannot deal with armed men. Gen. MacArthur and the army will do that."

"When those now in arms shall have laid them down, relying as they certainly can, upon the justice, generosity and clemency of the United States, we shall give them all a full hearing upon the policy to be pursued and the reforms to be initiated. We purpose to inaugurate as comprehensive a school system throughout the islands as circumstances will allow. I am surprised that Manila has not received news regarding the Spooner bill, a measure calculated to help us greatly in our work here."

It should be understood that the foregoing declaration of Judge Taft is in no sense intended as a proclamation.

Capture an Island.

Manila, June 6.—Maj. Johnson, with two companies of the Twenty-ninth infantry, was sent from Ramblon to the neighboring island of Tablas, where the men disembarked simultaneously in four columns, converging upon a central point. The Americans encountered about 60 rebels, who retreated, and the Americans captured 40, including all the officers, together with 10,000 rounds of ammunition and 24 rifles.

Very Active.

Manila, June 7.—The American troops are extremely active everywhere, and many skirmishes are occurring daily. Constant captures of arms are reported. The members of the Philippine commission are busy settling down in their houses.

Murderer Hanged.

Willamsport, Pa., June 6.—William H. Hummel was hanged here for the murder of his wife and her three children on November 16, 1896.

Against the Negro.

Richmond, Va., May 26.—Enough returns have been received from Thursday's election to show that the state has gone for a revision of the constitution by from 10,000 to 15,000. After the returns are inspected the governor may call an extra session of the legislature to provide for a convention. Almost the entire object of revision is the disfranchisement of the negro, and almost all the counties having a negro majority went against it. The vote cast was the lightest in years.

Chinese Emperor Acts.

London, May 31.—A special dispatch from Shanghai, dated Wednesday, says: "Yesterday the Chinese government issued an edict prohibiting the boxers' organization, under penalty of death. The edict, which was signed by the emperor, was couched in equivocal terms and promulgated really more as an excuse than in condemnation of the movement."

Headquarters to Be in Chicago.

Washington, May 29.—Chairman Babcock, of the republican congressional campaign committee, has arranged to make Chicago the main headquarters of that organization during the coming campaign, the old headquarters in Washington being continued as a branch.

Supreme Court Adjourns.

Washington, May 29.—The United States supreme court adjourned for the term Monday and will not sit again until next October.
