WANT TO KILL MCKINLEY.

Individual Members of An Anarchist Order in New Jersey Advocate His Assassination.

THREATS WERE UTTERED AT A MEETING

The Slayer of King Humbert Glorified - Young Girl Who Leads the Group Declares Other Rulers Are Fated - The Wife of Bressi is Stunned by Her Husband's Deed.

Paterson, N. J., Aug. 1.—The life of President McKinley has been threatened by the anarchists of this city who created the plot to assassinate King Humbert.

The threats were uttered at a meeting of anarchists called by the group to which King Humbert's assassin belonged.

Miss Crevella was the dominating figure of the occasion. She made a fiery speech, breathing threats against the czar of Russia, the new king of Italy and other rulers.

In an interview Miss Crevella said: 'We are members of the group of anarchists to which Bressi belonged. He is a martyr. He has done what we would have done.'

Looking for Accomplishes. There is a firm belief among the 5,000 odd Italians in Paterson that the Italian consul in New York has instituted a search on his own account.

Michigan Gets Her Money. Washington, July 31.—The treasury department on Monday delivered to the private secretary of the governor of Michigan a warrant for \$247,476.

New London, Mo., Aug. 2.—Alexander Jester, charged with the murder of Gilbert W. Gates 29 years ago, was acquitted by a jury here.

Pensioners Increase. Washington, Aug. 1.—Commissioner of Pensions Evans' report shows 991,519 pensioners on the roll, an increase of 2,010 the last year.

Money in Circulation. Washington, Aug. 2.—The total circulation of national bank notes on July 31 was \$320,015,356, an increase for the year of \$78,473,978.

Sailed for China. San Francisco, Aug. 2.—The transport Meade sailed yesterday for Taku, China, with 1,000 soldiers aboard.

ILLINOIS STATE NEWS.

Vacancies Filled. Gov. Tanner has appointed F. A. Houghton, Chicago, a member of the state board of education to succeed James H. Norton, deceased.

Three Persons Killed. Three persons and a team of horses were killed at the Broadway crossing of the Illinois Central railroad in Mattoon.

Crop Outlook. The weekly crop report of the Washington weather bureau says for Illinois:

A good growing week, but too much rain for harvesting and thrashing, wheat, oats and hay damaged by rains.

Oldest Postmistress. Mrs. M. M. Lamb, who had been a postmistress longer than any other woman in the country, died at her home in Annawan.

Fired in Self-Defense. Officer John Kelly was executed by a coroner's jury in Joliet for the killing of John Butler, a paroled convict.

Blew Open the Safe. Armstrong, a small village of 200 inhabitants, was visited by bank robbers, who effected an entrance into the Goodwin bank, blew open the safe and carried away \$3,300.

Illinois Apples Best. Much gratification is felt among the fruit men of Illinois over the signal victory won for their exhibit of apples at the Paris exposition.

Told in a Few Lines. Four women were killed and 37 other persons hurt as the result of an explosion and fire in a collar factory in Chicago.

Over 400 teachers secured diplomas in Pontiac at the ninth annual awarding of Livingston county diplomas.

President Harper told University of Chicago students that degrees meant next to nothing, and that Illinois was a disgrace throughout the civilized world on account of 'diploma mills' in Chicago.
