Febr. 15, 1912. The Board of Supervisors met at 9 o'clock, pursuant to adjournment, and were called to order by Chairman Walsh.

Minutes Approved. The minutes of yesterday's session were approved as read.

McCliduff & Thompson Bill. The members of the firm of McCliduff & Thompson appeared before the board and stated that inasmuch as the trial of Wm. Schultz had taken practically twice as much time as any one had anticipated...

Report of Committee on Auditing Sheriff's Accounts. The Committee on Auditing Sheriff's Accounts, to whom was referred the report of S. E. Sims with reference to the account of ex-Sheriff J. W. Morris, submitted the following report with reference to the same:

The report of S. E. Sims Mr. Morris was indebted to the county in the sum of \$2,606.52 and \$1,703.56, making the total amount due the sum of \$4,310.08.

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We would further report that with the approval of your committee, Mr. Morris employed Mr. Erastus Hoobler to check the books in the office of the circuit clerk and county clerk and find if there were earnings for which the county was liable...

Whereas, the present law for following up and returning such as so desert their families, is so seldom enforced, and whereas, if such law is fully enforced, no provision is made for the one so handled to support those dependent upon him if found to be without means...

Whereas, many in such circumstances would be willing to work to support their families if provision were made for it and would voluntarily apply for it rather than desert or see their families suffer.
