The Total Distributable Fund is \$13,793.85—The Division of the Money Among Township Treasurers.

ANTI-SULLIVAN CANDIDATE FOR DEMOCRATIC STATE CENTRAL COMMITTEEMAN, 17TH CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT.

C. S. SCHNEIDER, of Paxton, Illinois, has announced himself as a candidate for State Central Committeeman on the Democratic ticket, to be voted on at the Primaries, April 9th, 1912.

Mr. Schneider is not a stranger to the voters of this district as he made a strong race for Congress against Sterling at the last Presidential Election.
