Mr. Harry Clark has left this part of the country. Mr. Hutchings is now plowing corn for Mr. Chapple.

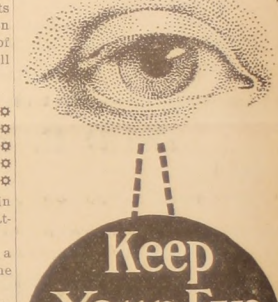
