**NEW TIME TABLE ON ALTON.**  
Traveling Public Given Better Service.

The new winter time card on the  
Chicago & Alton went into effect Sun-  
day, November 10. The changes are  
the most radical in a number of years  
and will reflect credit upon the man-  
agement. President Worthington has  
impressed it upon the passenger and  
operating departments, that he be-  
lieves that nothing is too good for the  
Alton patrons and he proposes to give  
them the finest service ever enjoyed.  
He can not supply everything that he  
has in mind just now as the equip-  
ment now owned by the company is  
not extensive enough to warrant all  
of the changes planned. New steel  
trains for crack runs, which will pro-  
bably be purchased next year, will per-  
mit the inauguration of additional lo-  
cal trains.

The changes authorized at the pre-  
sent time are of a noteworthy char-  
acter however, and will be applauded  
by the traveling public from one end  
of the system to the other. Of par-  
ticular interest to Dwight is the re-  
storing of the Accommodation which  
was taken off by the Clover Leaf ad-  
ministration despite a storm of pro-  
test. This train will leave Dwight at  
7:45 a. m. and reach Chicago at 10:05  
a. m. Returning it will leave Chicago  
at 4:15 p. m., carrying the car for  
Peoria, and reaching Dwight at 6:30  
p. m.

Other changes are as follows:  
Train No. 12, north bound, that ar-  
rived in Dwight at 10:10 a. m. will  
not stop here according to the new  
arrangements. Train No. 70, north-  
bound, a new train put into service,  
arrives at Dwight at 11:05 a. m. and  
reaches Chicago at 1:30 p. m. No. 4,  
northbound, arrives in Dwight at 5:33  
p. m. instead of 5:40 as before and  
connects with the branch train which  
arrives here at 5:40, ten minutes later  
than the old schedule. Train No. 71,  
southbound, due here at 6:15 p. m. on  
the old schedule, arrives now at 5:15  
p. m., one hour earlier than before.  
Train No. 60 on the Dwight branch  
arrives in Dwight at 10:53 a. m. in-  
stead of 10:00 a. m. and No. 61 leaves  
here at 7:00 a. m. instead of 7:30.  
No. 63, also on the branch, leaves  
Dwight at 6:40 p. m. instead of 6:20.  
No. 10, the early morning train, due  
here at 5:31 a. m. will not stop as in  
the past.
