

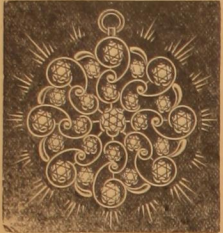

## PROPOSED RE-ORGANIZATION PLANS

### Re-Building of Spencer Factory Now Assured, Contingent on Concessions by Village and Chicago & Alton Railroad Company

Plans for the re-organization of the Spencer Hay Press Factory are rapidly crystallizing and within a comparatively short time, it is hoped, will be in concrete form and definite arrangements together with a prospectus prepared by experts in that line will be presented to the people of Dwight and vicinity for their consideration.

A meeting was held at the Dwight Commercial Club Tuesday evening by some of the officers of the Club at which Messrs. Spencer and Wright were present and preliminary arrangements for the new organization were discussed, after which the meeting adjourned to the City Hall, where the proposed plans were presented before the Council.

In order that the plant may be re-built along modern lines a few con-

day afternoon and prepared resolutions to be presented for the consideration of the Council and there is little doubt but that Mr. Spencer's wishes will be anticipated in every respect.

In addition to the concessions which must emanate from the Village authorities it will also be necessary that the Chicago & Alton Railroad install proper switching facilities for the plant by running a switch track directly into the factory yard and buildings. Heretofore the Spencer factory has had no switch for their own use and labored under great disadvantages in their shipping and receiving departments. It is hoped that the railroad officials will recognize the need of a direct switch into the factory so that a removal of the plant

cessions were asked for from the Village. While these are called concessions they are more properly needed public improvements in the part of town adjacent to the factory site. Water mains of a larger capacity in order to insure a better protection against fire, additional street lighting, continuation of the paving and projects of minor importance will be the extent of the concessions asked for from the town.

The citizens appearing before the Council were gratified by the public spirit, the energy and enthusiasm with which their propositions and requests were met by the Mayor and the other Council members. A motion was at once adopted authorizing the appointment of a Committee from the Council to meet with a Committee from the Commercial Club to take up the matter of the concessions needed and the Committees met Wednes-

day afternoon and prepared resolutions to be presented for the consideration of the Council and there is little doubt but that Mr. Spencer's wishes will be anticipated in every respect.

Mr. Spencer feels greatly encouraged with the spirit of the citizens of Dwight with which he is met on every hand and which is a certain indication that the citizens will respond to every requirement, financially and otherwise that may be necessary for the re-organization of the factory on a modern scale—larger, better and more efficient than ever—providing employment for a greater number of people than ever before and demonstrating that Dwight is too progressive to allow such a desirable enterprise to pass from her history.

### FORMER RESIDENT KILLED IN CHICAGO.

Body Brought Here for Burial.

Thomas Reel, 40 years of age and a former resident of this city, was killed in the freight yards at South Chicago last Friday evening while at work with a switching crew. Mr. Reel was an experienced railroad man and had been at work just an hour Friday evening when he was caught between two cars while engaged in making a coupling and received injuries which resulted in his death a short while after.

The body was brought to this city last Saturday and the funeral services were held Monday morning at 10 o'clock at St. Patrick's Catholic Church, Rev. Father J. F. Power officiating. Burial was made in the Catholic cemetery.

Mr. Reel was the second son of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Reel of this city, and was well known here, having worked in the Chicago & Alton yards in this city a number of years ago. He was a hardworking, industrious man and his sudden and untimely death was a great shock to his relatives as well as his many friends here.
