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POSTOFFICE NEWS

The holiday rush is almost here, and it is well for patrons to remember a few things, or a few don'ts:

Don't wait until a day or two or three before Christmas to send packages expecting them to arrive on time, because it is predicted that the rush will be greater than ever this year.

Don't forget that any patron is allowed to put on package "Not to be opened until Christmas," so if your present arrives ahead of time it will be O. K.—unless, of course, the bump of curiosity of the receiver is too well developed.

Don't forget that the postoffice force is anxious to get rid of mail, and if there is anything for you, you will get it.

Don't forget to put your name and address on packages. If they miscarry you will get them back. If you do not take this precaution they are liable to go to the dead letter division.

Don't write a letter or note and put in packages, for you make yourself liable to arrest and fine, just to save two cents. It won't pay.

Don't forget to wrap parcels carefully, but don't seal unless you want them to go first class.

Don't forget that five cents will insure any ordinary parcel post package.

Don't forget to help the carrier by

having a safe receptacle for mail. You can get a box in Dwight. Do it now. Don't keep him waiting. If you just won't buy a box be at the door when he comes, or you are liable to find your mail blown away or snow bound.

Don't make up your lists for the holidays and forget the carriers.

Don't forget to do your Christmas shopping early and send them early.

Don't forget to tell the clerks when you are mailing perishable or fragile matter, then they can mark it so and it will be given proper care.

Mail them early, wrap them securely and address them plainly.

If you expect to send your parcels by insured mail, obtain a few "insured" tags and take them to the postoffice tied to the packages you wish

insured after you have filled them out. They will be only too pleased at the postoffice to advise you in advance as to proper entries on tags, rates and proper packing.

Have parcels tightly and securely packed as flimsy parcels or boxes partially filled are handicapped before they start.

Do not include books, etc., in merchandise packages as that classifies the whole parcel at book rates, which are generally higher than merchandise.
