## Square Dance Slated For Saturday Night; More Attractions Listed

The Dwight Centennial Committee has added more attractions to the calendar for Centennial week August 15 through 22, it was announced at the Tuesday night session of the group.

A Kiddie Parade is slated for Monday, August 16. This previously had been an open date in the plans for our 100th birthday party.

They also voted to have a fireworks display following the historical pageant on Wednesday night as well as Thursday. These displays will be of equal size but will feature many different displays the two nights.

Special event program for this Saturday night should be a very popular one indeed. The committee has lined up Al Burkhart and four sets of square dancers from Goodfarm township to lead in an impromptu square dance on East Street beginning around 8 or 8:30.

These Goodfarm dancers are some of the best in Illinois and they will give quite an exhibition. They also want participation from the crowd so come down town and do a little square dancing.

A section of the street in front of the Kaiser store will be roped off and Mr. Burkhart will do the calling.

Various prizes, consisting of merchandising certificates will be given away that evening, which is July 24 by the way not the 23rd like we stated last week. These certificates will be handed out to various people and the merchants in Dwight are asked to honor these for the value stated and then the Centennial Committee will redeem them. This practice of prizes will be carried out on each Saturday night until Centennial Week.

Those big signs publicizing Dwight which were talked about a few weeks ago have become a reality and are now situated on spots around the entrances to Dwight. Take a look at them and you will see that Mr. Louis Groll has come up with another stellar job.

The big movement of informing people that Dwight will have their Centennial celebration next month is underway and one of the best means of publicity is to have the residents of this community tell their friends and relatives in surrounding villages and cities. An extensive poster campaign has been set up by the Centennial committee and these will be distributed far and wide.

This event is strictly crowd participation so come prepared for a fine evening. An interesting side-
