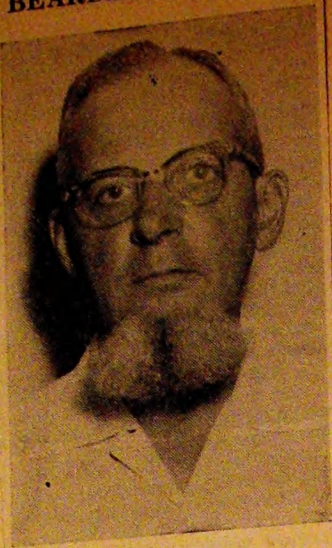

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Beard Judging Time, Place To Be Announced

Because of the Pageant rainout the time of the beard judging has been changed from 9 o'clock tonight. Announcement will be made at the Pageant and on Main street as to when and where the judging will take place.

Three barbers from Pontiac will be the judges and they will pick the best out of the following classifications: fullest, muttonchops, individual type, western, Abe Lincoln, Van Dyke, and the outstanding beard will be acclaimed the "grand Champion."

To be eligible to compete in the judging of the beard derbies, the man must be a member of the Bearded Brotherhood and must live within a seven mile radius of this community.

The beard judging is expected to attract a gala crowd and the winners in each division will surely be deserving of their awards. The chin whiskers, mustaches and all the rest have done much towards publicizing our Centennial the past few months and the judges from the Chief City will have a rough time in picking out the winners since there are some lusus around this area.

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Tops in Bearded Brother Divisions Announced Saturday

The Bearded Brotherhood of Dwight stepped into the spotlight following the Historical Pageant at OAF Saturday night for the final judging of beards. Over 100 men were entered in the foliage derby and the three Pontiac barbers, Delbert Ninemeyer, William Powell and Clyde Piece, had a tough time in proclaiming the six winners.

While they were in the process of picking the best in each group, Edward C. Dickler, chairman of the Centennial Committee, spoke a few words of appreciation to all those who made the pageant and Centennial celebration such a roaring success.

James R. Baker, chairman of the Beard judging contest, exceed the event, and introduced Harold J. West, who in turn introduced many old Alumni of Dwight and told of the reunion held earlier in the evening on the school lawn.

Other members of the committee were Hugh Thompson, Mr. West and Ralph Williams.

All beard entrants had to meet two qualifications: They had to live within a 7 mile radius of Dwight and they must own and wear a Dwight Bearded Brotherhood button.

 - Best Muttonchops, Patrick Cleary.
- Each of these gentlemen were presented with an electric razor.

A Schick 20 was donated by L. L. Stitzer of Dwight; a Sunbeam was donated by the Sunbeam corporation through the cooperation of Olson Tire Service and L. L. Stitzer; a Remington was donated by the Remington Rand Company, and the Centennial Committee donated the other three Remingtons.
