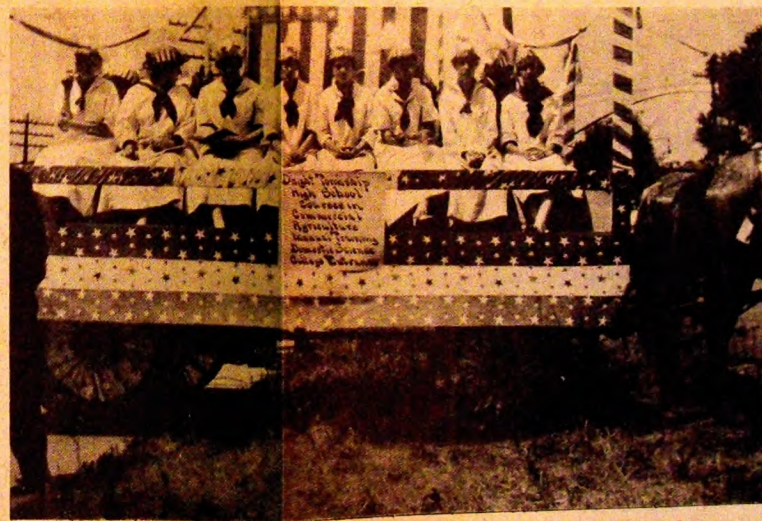


THIS 1910 POSTCARD depicting "Renfrew Lodge, Dwight" was brought to Star Newspapers by Glen Thomas after he read a story in the Feb. 20 edition of the Dwight Star & Herald concerning the 1860 visit to Dwight by the Prince of Wales. The Prince (Baron Renfrew) stayed in J. C. Spencer's hunting lodge, which was thereafter known as "Renfrew Lodge." The lodge burned down in about 1924. It was located near where a house now stands at the north side of Creek Ridge Mobile Home Community on East Spencer St.
