Another Old Settler Gone to Join the Silent Majority.

Mrs. Emeline Cornell died at the residence of her son, George, in Moberly, Missouri, at 5:10 a. m., January 3, 1892, where she had been visiting since October 7, 1891. She leaves one son and two daughters to mourn her loss, together with many friends in this place.

In company with her husband, Nelson Cornell, she came West when the site of this town was an unbroken prairie (that was during the year 1854) and settled on a farm one mile northwest of town, where they made their home until the death of her husband, January 29, 1882. After his death she moved to town. She made Dwight her home until her death.

Her remains were brought here for interment, and were laid to rest by the side of her husband in Oak Lawn cemetery.

Deceased was born in Milan, Dutchess County, New York, August 12, 1823, and was 68 years old at the time of her death.

Several months ago she was taken down with a severe attack of la grippe, from which she never wholly recovered. She was able to be about the house, however, and concluded that a trip to Moberly would improve her health. The journey was too much for her, and she was compelled to take to her bed, from which she was never able to arise.
