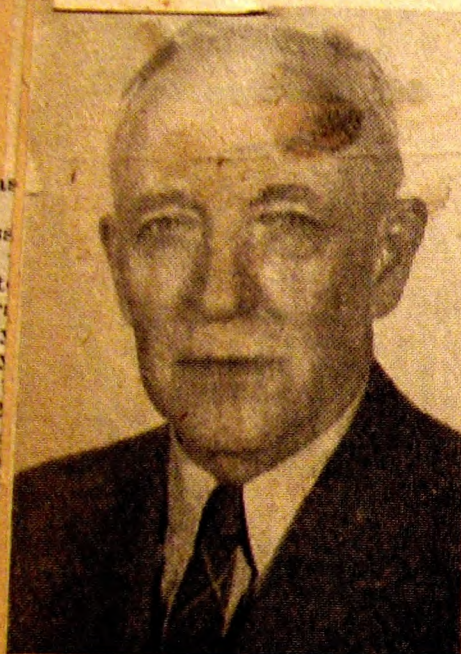

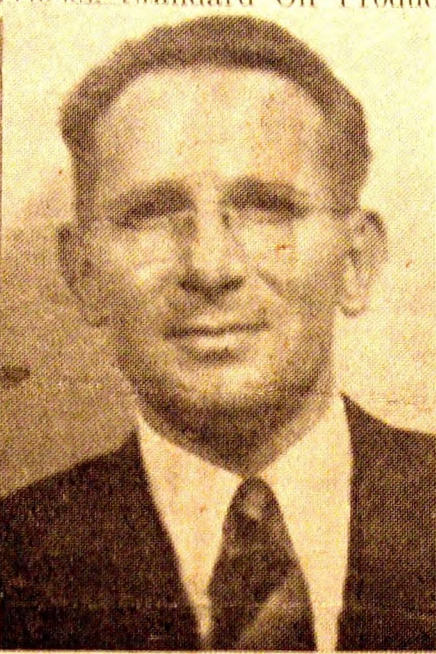
ALLAN S. HOLBROOK

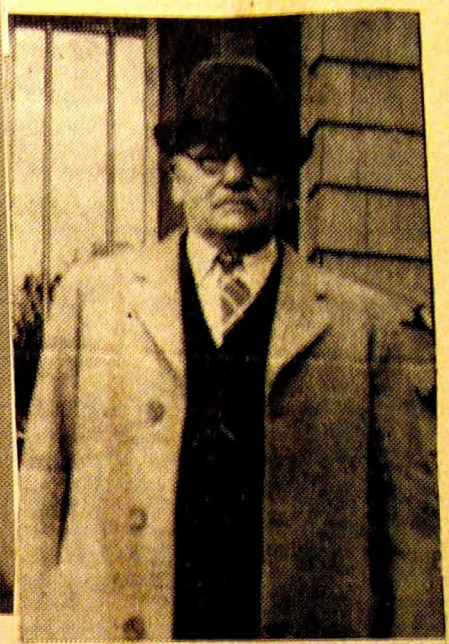
WM. A. ZSCHAU
