At the first rosy flush of mornning the  
Church and Hotel bells will ring out  
their glad notes of welcome, And a thun-  
dering SALOOT will greet the rising sun  
from every available anvil in the corpo-  
rate limits. At 9 a m. the military and  
civic organizations will meet at the  
west park and form in the regular order  
of procession. The City fathers led by  
the polished, affable and corteous S. T.  
K. Prime, will be followed by the Dwight  
silver band discoursing the usual airs  
suitable to the occasion. Next in order  
comes the DWIGHT RIFLES Col. Kemise  
commanding. assisted by the Maj's Gil-  
christ and Judd, supported by the gen-  
tlemanly Captain Stevens and anxious  
but sympathetic Surgeon Keeley, who is  
expected to flourish his field case in lieu  
of a sword on that occasion. The mili-  
tary will be followed by the redoubtable

tions will be suitably adorned to make  
him feel patriotic. After which will fol-  
low Mr. Bakers Hearse, plumed and  
drawn by the ancient war horse PEGASUS,

bury will be on the ground to report,  
dressed in the STAR spangled Banner
