**R. R. MEETING.**

In pursuance of a call, the citizens of Dwight met at the Town House, to discuss the interests of the town in connection with a proposed Rail Road between Dwight and Streator.

Orin Gould was called to the chair and L. G. Pearre appointed Secretary. M. E. Collins being present, was called upon and in a clear and emphatic manner, placed the advantages of such a road before the people, and gave a short, clear outline of the organization, condition, prospects, and intention of the Vermillion Coal Co. in whose interest the proposed road is now being built. Short speeches were made by Messrs. Strong, Morgan, Smith, Dunlop, Bradbury, M' Williams and others; all setting forth the advantage to be derived from a cross-road running through Dwight. On motion of R. P. Morgan, a committee of three was appointed to confer with the present managers of the proposed road and obtain propositions to be submitted to the people of Dwight at a future meeting. R. P. Morgan Jr., J. G. Strong, and L. G. Pearre were chosen as a committee.

Mr. P. Morgan offered the following resolution which was unanimously adapted.

Resolved: That the people of Dwight are ready and willing to lend their aid and means to any enterprise that in their opinion is calculated to advance the interests of their town.

On motion the meeting adjourned to meet again at the call of the committee.
